Safeguarding

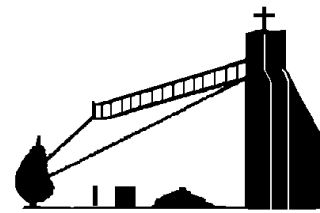
If there are any safeguarding concerns in or out of the church, please speak to the Parish Safeguarding Officer Chrissie
