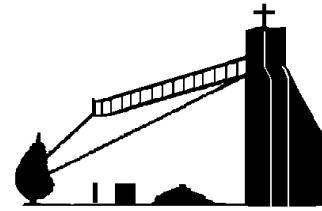
Safeguarding

Thought for the Week: A Mighty Barrier by Ian Bradley

There is only one thing that comes between Satan and success, and that's the name of Jesus. It is our barrier against evil of every kind. 'There is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven . . . by which we must be saved,' said Peter (Acts 4:12).

The name of Jesus, in the simplest (yet most profound) terms, is the greatest power in the earth, in heaven, in the universe. It can turn fear into faith. It can move mountains. It is indestructible. And he has given us the privilege of using it, here and now.

Jesus bequeathed it to us as part of his last (and only) will and testament.
